

CONDITIONAL RELEVANCY

RULE 104(5)

When the relevancy of evidence:

The Rim (Fact B)

depends upon

The fulfillment of a condition
of FACT:

That the rim belonged to C's car (Fact A)

Such Evidence

The Rim (Fact 5)

Shall be admitted

Subject to the intro of evidence

(for example, testimony that the rim had
markings which indicate it could only have
come from C's car.)

Sufficient to support a finding of
the fulfillment of the condition.*

that the rim belonged to C's car. (Fact A)

*The standard is known as the Sufficiency Test:

Evidence sufficient for a jury to find the fulfillment of the condition by a preponderance
of the evidence.
